Their work is predominantly concerned with ideas for future and otherness; playing with image and narrative as a means of deconstructing and reconstructing space and city, ultimately with the aim to incite provocative thought around perceptions of Johannesburg. In 2015, the firm was invited to participate in the inaugural Chicago Architecture Biennial, where they showcased their work entitled 'Lost and Found', in collaboration with photographer Jason Larkin.
